Just what is "World Evangelism"?

We are a combination of

business (J.C.'s rule about printing: don't ever be in debt on printing, but print enough copies of a book to sell enough to pay the printer, and then you can give away! That remains our guide in every part of our work.)

and **service** (we supply books, tracts, and other printed materials to brethren here, often below our cost — and we ship thousands of copies overseas, free of charge!),

evangelism (our team members make regular and extended trips overseas, teaching in training programs so that the force for outreach — brethren — can be deepened spiritually),

and **motivation**. What do we mean by "motivation"? Jesus' great command to His people was, "Go into all the world and preach the Gospel!" Through our printed materials, written reports, and personal visits with churches across the US, our goal is to motivate brethren to obey that great command.



THE STORY OF SOULS

Betty Burton Choate

J.C. Choate preached in a Gospel meeting in Winona in 1952, before the times when visiting preachers were housed in motels, so he stayed in our home. According to his diary entries, he called the various denominational preachers in town, had personal studies during the days with people who came to the evening meetings, and baptized seven souls and restored three. He had a flat tire on the way down and a blow-out on the way home; didn't get back to Corinth until 4:30 in the morning. And it was a "mission meeting"—free;



but he concluded that we were "very fine people" and he would "never forget this place". He was 20, the eldest son of Jesse and Hollis Choate of Corinth, MS, and I was 12, the daughter of Clyde and Theola Burton.

I thank God for bringing our paths to cross, for the 52 years of life together, and for

the blessing of being tools in His outreach for souls that was far greater than we could ever have imagined with our small-town backgrounds. But a trip to the "Holy Land" before our marriage had opened J.C.'s eyes to the expanse of the world and the multitudes of souls, so I was not greatly surprised when he confided one day that he wanted us to do some mission work overseas. India was his choice because it was the largest democracy without the Gospel.

In 1960 he resigned from local work with the Central church in Minneapolis, MN and we moved into the house with Daddy and Mother in Winona. We had no sponsor and no income, but it never crossed our minds to doubt that the support would be raised and

that we would be able to go, because this was what Jesus had told His people to do.

Someone made the remark at the beginning, "They won't last long." And with the visa difficulties during those years in India, some one else questioned, "Why don't you go somewhere where you can stay long enough to do some good?"

The story is long — 57 years, and continuing. Part of the time we were in Pakistan, working closely with Gordon Hogan, then in Sri Lanka, then in India, as a family. Our firstborn, Sheila, was one- and one-half years old when we moved to Pakistan. Steve was born there a year later. We adopted my niece, Darla, when we came home after four years in Pakistan.

We returned to Pakistan in 1967, helped a replacement family to get settled, and then moved to Colombo, Sri Lanka where we worked to establish the church and to help a replacement family settle into that country. In the fall of 1968 we moved to New Delhi, India to begin the Lord's church there. We had a three-month visa, had it extended for three months, were allowed to stay another six weeks, and then had to return to the States after a total of two years in the three countries.

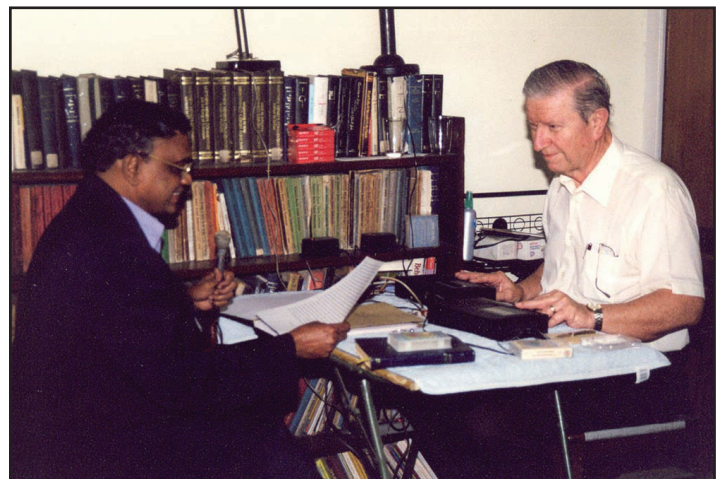
Sunny David, along with others, had been converted during the short time in Delhi, but the church was too young to be left without guidance. Realizing the impossibility of moving a family of five in and out of India, J.C. returned and spent 1970 there alone. When we went back to India as a family in 1972, Shannon (Brad) was four months old, and Barbara Oliver had decided to join us as "extended family". We were a happy and busy seven, and hoped to get long-term visas that would enable an extended stay in India.

The small church in New Delhi had grown in knowledge as well as in numbers during J.C.'s time there and subsequent absence. Moving the meeting place to the living room of the house we rented, and using personal visits, Bible courses, a monthly magazine, and hospitality as means to contact and convert



people, we were encouraged by the continued growth. After we had exhausted the visa time allowed for tourists, through pressure exerted by some influential people, we were finally given permission to apply for visas as a journalist, for one year. At the end of the year, to our disappointment, the visas were not granted (the government avoiding setting a precedent that would have enabled us to get renewals each year). So we had no choice but to turn things over to the local brethren again and to come back to the States.

But we felt far from defeated. We had learned that it was now possible to buy time for religious broadcasting on Radio Sri Lanka, and that the programs could be heard over much of Asia. The negative was that we had no equipment or funds for the programs, so we knew that if we took on such a challenge, J.C. would have to split his time between being in the States to

raise support to cover all the costs, and being in India to record the programs. By that time we had formed working relationships with preachers in South India who had been Christians a number of years and were mature in their knowledge, as well as being capable speakers, so we felt that we could arrange for programs in several of the major languages. Brother

Reggie Gnanasundaram, in Colombo, Sri Lanka, was able to manage the contracts with the radio station. How providential had been our detour to Sri Lanka, prior to India, and the conversion of such a capable man to fill an essential role in the work!

From 1975 through 1995, J.C. spent three months in the spring and three months in the fall in India, alone, recording radio tapes himself in English, recording the various Indian speakers in four of their languages, and working with them on the literature to be used in follow-up. The other six months he visited churches to raise the funds for the programs we had never expected to be able to have.

Because we could not get long-term visas for India, and because he had to be in the States to raise funds, the children and I lived in Winona during those 20 years. I admit, we had never planned on doing mission work by separation, and it was a cost that had to be counted. Analyzing the pros and cons, we knew we could not put our own human preferences above the opportunity to help bring the truth to many who would be reached in no other way except through mass media. After we committed to the sacrifice, we discovered that God turned it around and made it into a blessing in countless ways, allowing us to work together on opposite sides of the world!

The radio programs grew in number, and sometimes they shrank because of not enough funds to keep all of them going. J.C. had an English program, Sunny David spoke in Hindi, Joshua Gootam in Telugu, P.R. Swamy in Tamil, and P.K. Varghese in Malayalam. With extreme effort we maintained good coverage in those prominent languages of India. The response in mail and requests for Bible courses and literature was overwhelming, so the need to raise funds for printing mushroomed.

In J.C.'s travels back and forth, he realized how much literature and radio work were needed in other places, so he raised funds for those needs too.

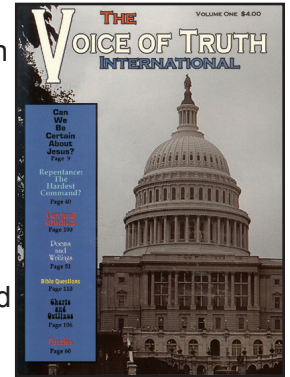
For several years there was an aggressive program of printing and radio work in Indonesia, which was curtailed when the local man through whom he was working came to the States for further education. Some printing continues to be



done through Colin Mckee and others who are working there. In time, about 20 broadcasts were arranged for various islands in the Philippines, with literature for follow-up, co-ordinated by Reuben Emperado. During this time, also, Wayne and Janet Barrier retired from their jobs and became full-time partners in the mission effort.

Part of the work on the American side was the publication of a newspaper, *World Evangelism*, which served as our own report venue and also provided space for us to help publicize the work being done by other missionaries in many parts of the world. J.C. had also wanted to print a quarterly, Reader's Digest-sized magazine to be shared among Christians in the States as well as in mission fields. Finally, in 1994 we brought out the first issue of *The Voice of Truth International*, with J.C. as the Editor, Byron Nichols as the Managing Editor, and me doing the lay-out work. In 1993 we had constructed the World Evangelism office building, with a lot of volunteer help (Andy Akins, G.K. Tanner, Clayton Malone, Clyde Burton, and others) to house our "staff" — J.C., Barbara Oliver, Eulene Ramsey, and me — and to provide storage for the books we were printing in the States.

J.C.'s first book had been printed in 1953, *Sermon Outlines*. I wrote *First Steps in Faith*, about

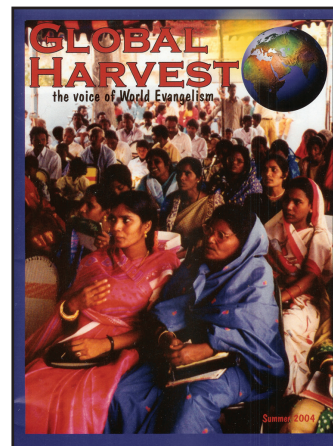
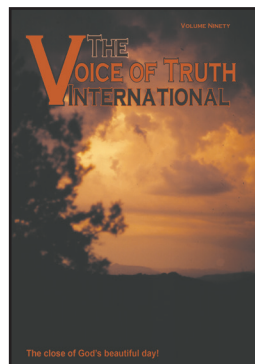

our mission efforts, in 1969. He had written numerous study books to supplement the Bible courses being offered overseas and had decided that it would be good to make them available outside of India. He had also encouraged many missionaries to write their stories, in spite of the fact that he knew there was not much "market" for them. But he felt that the record needed to be available for posterity, so he enabled the printing of more mission stories than probably any other publisher in the church.

Overall, more than 250 titles are available, with twenty-five or more being offered to **World Bible School** teachers, people involved in jail ministries, and to those who would use them in evangelism at \$1.50 per copy — often below cost. Countless books are given away, and thousands are sent free of charge each year to people/churches overseas, so that the printing of books here in the States has grown to be another major outreach. Book sales pay for the printing, which is a "service" rather than a "business", per se.

The Voice of Truth International is used widely in the US, as well as being sent to brethren throughout the world, free of charge. The current issue is volume 93. All told, more than 5,000,000 would be in circulation. John Thiessen became a co-worker with a Spanish version of the magazine, bringing out seven issues before his death in 2006. Efrain Aranda has now agreed to serve as the new Editor. We are thankful for his help. **The Voice of Truth International** is also translated and printed in India in English (Kingsly Rajah, Manager and Distributor), Hindi (Earnest Gill, Translator and Editor), Tamil (Benny and Rajanayagam, Translators and Editors),

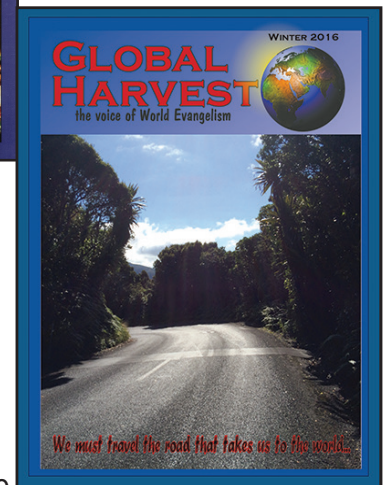

printed in Nigeria (Makinde Olufemi, Manager) and Ghana (Seth Larbi, Manager) in English, and distributed to neighboring nations. From the States we ship boxes of the magazine to about 60 additional countries.

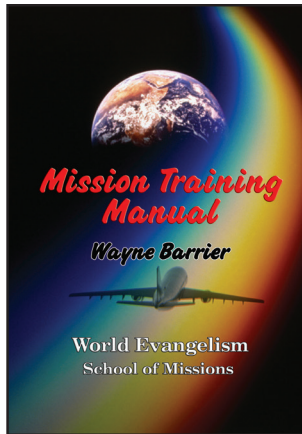
Another great need J.C. saw was for a good mission news magazine, carrying articles not only about our work but also what is being done throughout the world by fellow-Christians. Ultimately, we discontinued the printing of the **World Evangelism** newspaper, intending to publish **Global Harvest** instead. We did bring out one issue, a 48-page, full-color news magazine, allowing space to feature work being done in many parts of the world. We had hoped to make it a quarterly publication, also, but because of J.C.'s illness it had to be shelved temporarily. We now print one issue annually, limited by time for lay-out and funds for printing.

Telugu (Joshua Gootam, Translator and Editor), Marathi (Amul Vansod, Translator and Editor), and Paite (Thang Lien, Translator and Editor), and is shipped from there to neighboring countries. It is

J.C. had envisioned a mission training school (**World Evangelism School of Missions**), bringing former or currently “at home” missionaries together to train prospective men from their experience gained from years on the field. Wayne Barrier has taken the lead in organizing the writing of the curriculum for this school, drawing from monthly meetings we had with fellow-missionaries. The first training program began in August, 2008. Sessions are conducted at **Heritage Christian University**, and with individual congregations on request.

Following the organizing of a Bible Training School in Myanmar, schools are now in operation in numerous places. Wayne and his sons, Jeremy, Joey, and Jamie coordinate the teaching in these schools, along with raising funds for their operation and working with local brethren in their development.

After twenty years of working much of the time on opposite sides of the world, in 1994 when our children had left the nest, J.C. and I were blessed to do everything together — weekend visits to churches, trips to India and other countries, work here at home. What wonderful years! We talked and planned and prayed and cried and exulted and dreamed and waited and worked, *together*. What wonderful years!


In 2002 J.C. was diagnosed with colon cancer. Following surgery, for three years he was seemingly cleared and was able to continue with the usual work routine, but in 2005 the cancer had metastasized to his lungs. Surgery left him short-winded so that he was very limited from that time in what he could do. Providentially, this gave him time to train me in what I would be able to do to carry on the work. Of course, we were convinced that others were needed in Winona and to make the trips overseas, but our efforts to locate couples willing to raise their support and to take on that here-again/there-again lifestyle seemed futile. Finally, in the spring of 2007 J.C. concluded that maybe in God’s wisdom it was time for the brethren overseas to

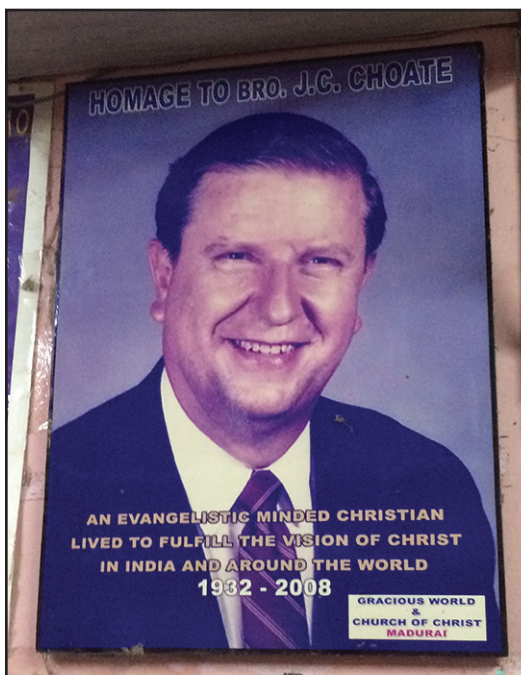
carry on the work without foreign involvement. We surrendered.

Then, in July, Wayne Barrier called to say that Jerry Bates and his wife were interested in coming to talk with us about the work, and in August the Louis Rushmores visited. Both couples committed to moving to Winona, raising their support, and taking up the challenges of the work overseas! God answers every prayer with a “Yes!” when He sees that that is for the best.

J.C. Choate crossed over into that eternal life on February 1, 2008. Even though his time to work in this world has ended, his *vision* of things that needed to be done and his *foundational work* with God and with many in the US and in other countries of the world, have not ended. It is exciting to see God moving everything forward, seamlessly, in spite of death. Read the continuation of the story in further pages of our “catalog”. 

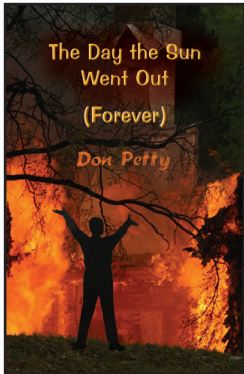

The Death of Abel

Solomon Gessner

This precious book was written in 1762 by a German man, Solomon Gessner. The tiny 3" by 5" leather-bound copy I have was printed in 1833. Entering a world of poetic, flowery speech may seem difficult at first, but it transports the reader to a setting just outside the Garden of Eden. Of course, it is only a novel based on the Scriptures, but reading it is so like an enlarging of the small glimpse the Genesis record gives of our first parents and their children. Perhaps the beauty of the book lies in the repeated references of each one to the realization of what life had been before the fall, as compared to their present world.

When Adam and Eve left the Garden, they must have seen many immediate effects of their sin, and as they lived their lives, having new experiences and realizations, often through the years they would have seen yet another and another terrible thing their sin had caused. The first occasion of sickness is poignantly related, with all the fear of the unknown and what the result of this malady might be. Cain's jealousy of Abel is developed, ending in the brutal killing of his brother. Adam and Eve begin the walk to visit their sons, happy in the beauty of the day... **"They now come from behind some bushes, Eve walking a little before, when suddenly stepping back, she cried with a tremulous voice, 'Who lies there? Adam, who's that lies there? He lieth not like one asleep. His face is on the ground — those locks are Abel's! Adam, why do I tremble? Abel! Awake, awake, my son! Turn to me thy face — turn to me thy face! Awake, ah! awake, dear son, from a sleep that freezes me with terror!' She now sunk from the arms of Adam on the dead. 'My son — my son!' she cried, speaking to insensible clay: 'Thine eyes are fixed; no more they turn on me. Awake, awake! Alas! I call in vain! He is dead! That is death, the death with which we were threatened when cursed by God after the fall. Oh, insufferable torment! I was the first sinner! O my husband! spouse beloved and dear, thy tears rend my heart! It was I that seduced thee....'"**

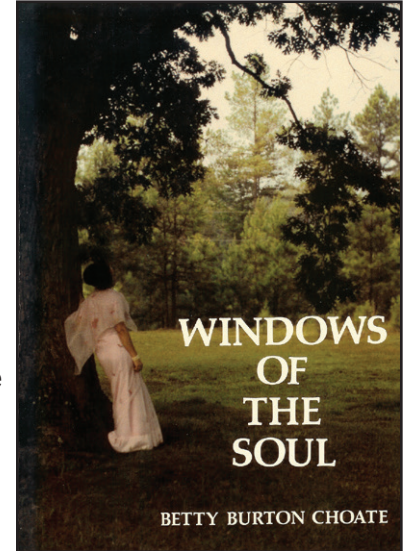

 Will beat in the hearts I adore:

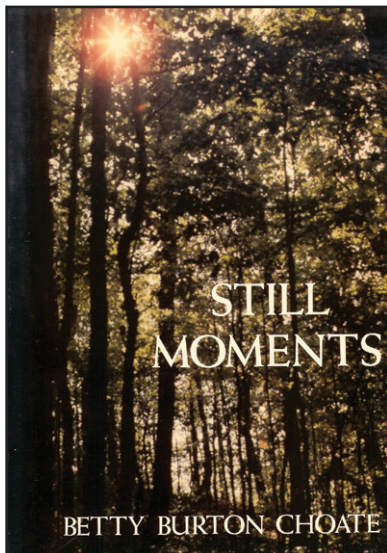

"Moments" — little blocks of time, removed from the whole of life and kept apart to cherish. Sometimes it seems the still moments are also the sober ones, near to tears ... and

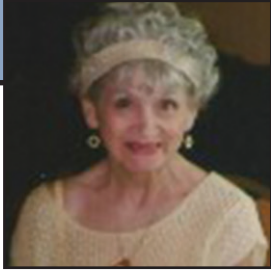


perhaps it is so. I seldom take the time to write in the midst of a flurry of activity, bubbling over with happiness.

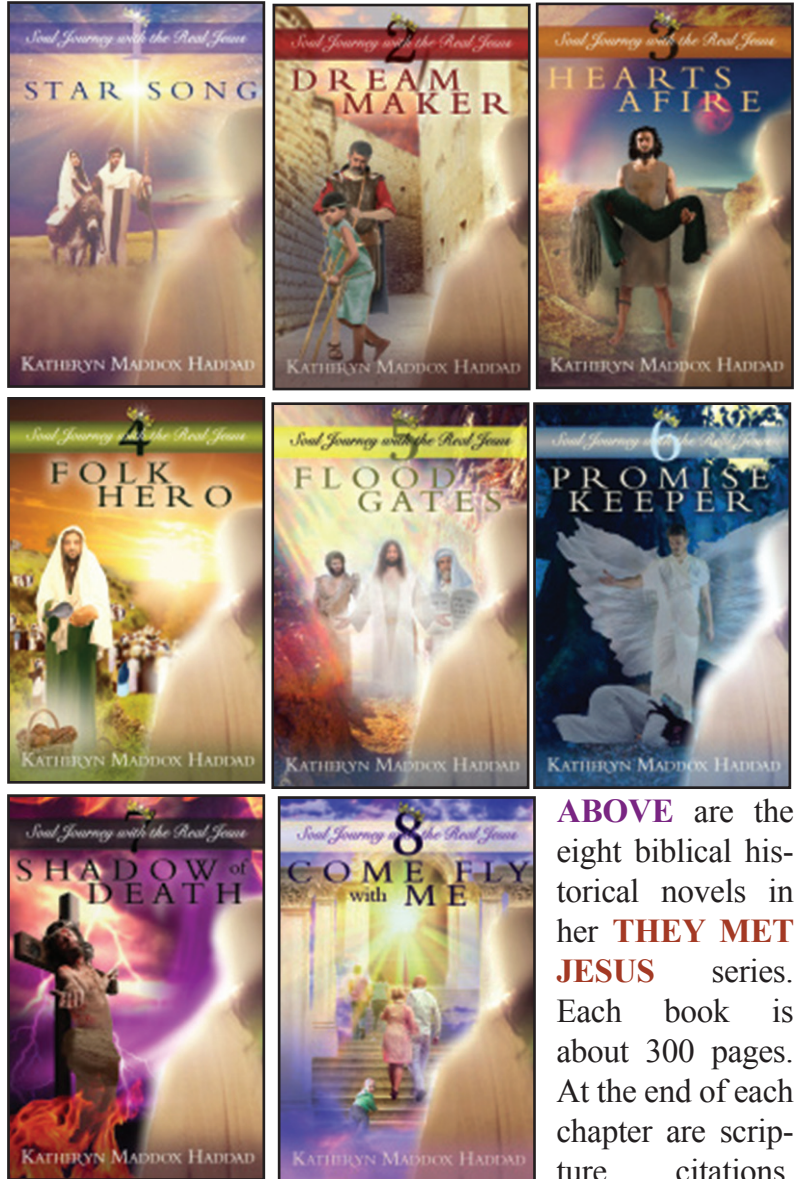
KATHERYN HADDAD is a prolific writer of books with a spiritual message. “My goal in every book is to save

Tying a Saree, Indian Style

For those adventuresome ladies who plan some day to do mission work in India, or for those who admire the dress and simply think they would like to try it, here are pictures to show you the steps to perfection!

The blouse can be a pretty, dressy knit, preferably with short sleeves. The fabric for the sari can always be bought at a local Indian food/merchandise store -- there are many of them in the country now. Or any soft, draping material will do fine. Buy 6 yards of 45 inch fabric. Hem the ends. You will need a full-length, half-petticoat with a tight band or a drawstring.

Whenever I speak to Ladies' Classes, in India or in the States, I wear a sari (my "uniform" — pronounced like an apology: sor-ry!). It allows me to "speak" of mission work, whether or not that is my assigned topic. Sarees are good "ice breakers", too, because women are always interested in what women wear in other countries and cultures.



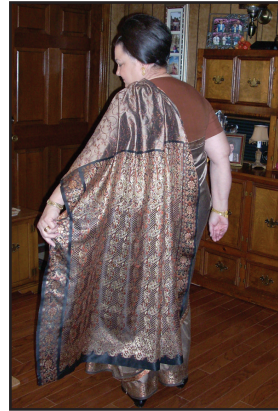
You begin with SIX yards of 45-inch fabric!



1 & 2: Begin with a knot in the upper right corner of the fabric. Then a 4" deep pleat is folded and tucked in the center front, allowing room to walk.



3 & 4: The fabric is brought around the waist and tucked in again at the right side of the waist. The left end is folded together, and brought around the waist, under both arms.



5 & 6: The end is brought around under the right arm, draped over the left shoulder, allowing about four feet to hang down the back. The fabric at the waist, in the left hand, is brought over and tucked into the waist band at the right side.



7 & 8: Looking down the center front, fold the excess back and forth into 4" pleats, allowing each one to extend 1/4' beyond the previous one. Tuck into the waist band.



9 & 10: The "pallu" becomes a shawl on cool days or a head covering in worship, particularly in the South, or in the presence of a father-in-law or person of importance.

That Hair....

One day, as I was walking in a bazaar in New Delhi, India, a street vendor remarked, “Yeh bal asli nahin hai!” (That hair is not real!) I turned and smiled and assured him, to his great surprise, “Han, yeh bal asli hai!” (Yes, this hair IS real!) And it is: my hair, my original color, with the addition of hair spray to hold the contrary nylon-thread-type stuff in place until bedtime! I’ve saved a mint, doing it myself (10 minutes each morning), no beauticians, no perms, no dye, no professional haircuts!

Years ago when I was trying to devise a system to deal with straight, body-less hair, I never dreamed that an image was in the making! I had an inkling, though, when we went into the staid old British restaurant in downtown Delhi one night as a special treat. The waiter took our order, and then said, “I believe you came here before, Madam. I remember your hair.”

Another time, at a world’s fair, a lady walked up and said, “You are Betty Choate! I recognized your hair!” So, in time it became impossible to change styles. People would have thought I had died and J.C. had married a new wife! My sister says I have to fix it before breathing my last because no one else could do it. I think I’ll just leave an order not to open the box!



1 & 2: First, a middle part is made, and the two sections above the ears are twisted and pinned out of the way. The back is divided into two parts and lightly teased. Then I bend over and brush the underside, pulling it together and binding it in a pony-tail holder. To give some shape to the front, I pin a hair band in place, front to back, instead of over the top of the head, as they are usually worn. Bent over, I brush the front layer lightly so that it will be smooth, without any of the teasing showing through.

Now, if you think it didn’t take courage to put these “in-the-making” pictures in the catalog, you are absolutely wrong! But for those who have long hair and want to try it, here are the directions!



3 & 4: Standing straight, and laying the smoothed layer over and down, I carefully arrange the hair over a hair band turned front to back instead of up and down, lightly brushing where necessary to get a smooth surface. I tuck in the ends, first on the right side, then on the left, making a smooth and — hopefully — not a lop-sided bun!



5 & 6: With the back section arranged and sprayed, the two front sections are brushed out and teased. Then the top layer is brushed lightly to be smooth. The right side is laid in place, pinned, ends tucked at the back and sprayed to hold the shape.



7 & 8: The left side is lightly brushed, laid in place, ends tucked, and pinned in place. The rough edges are covered with a clip. Voila and hooray! Out of the way for another day!

Communion Bread

1 cup of plain bread flour
1/4 cup of olive oil
1/4 cup of water
1/4 tsp. salt



Mix together to form soft ball and coat heavily in flour. Roll out on a sprayed cookie sheet to desired thickness. Score into 16 pieces with a seamstress' tracing wheel or knife. Bake at 400 degrees until lightly browned. Will make enough bread for at least 100 partakers.

Italian Cream Cake

1 stick of butter	1 tsp. soda
1/2 cup shortening	1 cup buttermilk
2 cups sugar	1 tsp. vanilla
5 egg yolks	1 cup chopped black walnuts
2 cups self-rising flour	5 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Cream butter and shortening. Add sugar and beat until smooth. Add egg yolks and beat until smooth. Combine flour and soda, and add to the mixture, alternately with milk. Add vanilla and nuts. Fold in the egg whites.

Grease three 9" round pans and dust with flour or, preferably, cover the greased pans with round coffee filters. (They work beautifully! Just don't get so engrossed in stacking your cake that you forget to peel them off!) Bake 25 minutes at 350 degrees.

Frosting

1 8 oz. package cream cheese
1/2 stick of butter
1 box confectioner's sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
1/2 cup finely chopped black walnuts

Beat cheese and butter until smooth. Add sugar and mix well. Add vanilla. After frosting each layer, sprinkle with nuts. Frost top and sides of the cake, sprinkling chopped nuts all around. (The key to the irresistible flavor is the combination of cream cheese and black walnuts. Pecans and English walnuts just don't do the job. BBC) Selfishly reserve a slice or two for solitary ecstasy, with a good book. SHHH!

Scrumdidiliumptuous Cake

2 1/2 cups of plain flour
2 tsp. soda
1 15oz. can crushed pineapple
1 1/2 cups sugar
1/2 tsp. salt
2 eggs

Mix flour, salt, soda, and sugar first, then stir all ingredients together well, using only a spoon — a "quick stir" cake!

Grease 3 cake pans (9 inch, round) and line with coffee-filter liners. Divide batter evenly; bake at 350 degrees until golden brown. Cool 15 minutes in pans. (Be sure to peel off coffee liners before stacking!)



Filling

Mix together 1 cup butter, 1 cup evaporated milk, 1 1/2 cups sugar. Cook until slightly thickened. Stir in 1 cup chopped nuts, 1 cup Baker's coconut, 1 tsp. vanilla. Lavish between layers, not on sides, though some will ooze down. Enjoy!

Caramel Corn

Pop corn to make 2 gallons, shaken down and lifted out to another bowl so the unpopped kernels can be removed — hard on the teeth! can be a \$400-\$600 treat!

Syrup

1 lb. box brown sugar
1 cup corn syrup
1 cup butter
2 cups raw peanuts

Mix ingredients in a thick saucepan and boil for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and add 1 tsp. soda, 1 tsp. vanilla, stirring quickly. Syrup will foam.

In manageable batches, pour hot syrup over popped corn and stir to coat evenly. Spread in two shallow pans and bake in 250 degree oven for 1 hour, stirring occasionally. Dump the caramelized corn on the counter top, separate quickly and allow to cool. Store in airtight container. Promises to keep well but mine never does. Wonder why???

Dinner Rolls, Sweet Rolls

2 cups of milk
6 tbs. sugar
1/4 cup shortening
Heat, and cool to lukewarm.

Dissolve 5 Tsp. of loose yeast (or two pkgs.) in 1/2 cup of lukewarm water.

To milk mixture, add 3 cups of bread flour and 2 tsp. salt. Beat till very smooth with an electric mixer.

Beat in 2 eggs and the yeast mixture. Add 2 more cups of flour and continue to mix with the mixer. Now add approximately 2 more cups of flour and mix well by hand, kneading until smooth on a floured surface. Place in greased bowl, turn, cover with a damp cloth, and let rise till double. Punch down, shape into rolls; let rise till double. Bake at 425 degrees for 15 minutes.

Sweet Rolls and Topping

Roll dough to 1/4" thickness. Spread with mixture: 2 cups sugar, 1/2 cup evaporated milk, 1 tsp. vanilla. Cinnamon, raisins, nuts, or chocolate (1/2 cup) may be added to the spread, as desired. Roll up dough, and slice by circling the dough with dental floss and pulling it together to cut the dough. Place in greased baking pans, and let rise till double, covered. Bake.

For each 9" pan of rolls, mix 1/2 cup sugar, 1/4 cup evaporated milk, 1/4 cup butter. Boil till slightly thickened. Add vanilla and spoon over the rolls. Mmm!

Okra or Onion Rings

1 large onion, sliced 1/4" thick and separated into rings. Salt liberally, coat with a mixture of 1 beaten egg and 1 large heaping spoon of plain yogurt or 1/4 cup buttermilk. Retaining as much of the egg mixture as possible, scoop the onion rings into a bag containing 1 1/2 cups of plain flour. Shake so that the rings are well coated with the flour and not gooey. Add more flour if necessary. When dry enough to separate, shake off excess flour and drop a few at a time into hot corn oil or olive oil, and cook until golden. Gently turn once, remove with a slotted spatula and mop off excess oil.

Okra, sliced 1/4" thick and prepared the same way is delicious. Either of these served, mixed, with heated cashew nuts will be a popular dish.

Chicken Curry

2 medium onions, chopped
2 med. tomatoes, chopped
1 tsp. fresh garlic
1/2 tsp fresh ginger
2 Tbs. MDH curry spices
1/3 cup corn oil
6 or 7 pieces chicken
2 tsp. salt

Brown the onion, garlic, and ginger in oil until golden. Add the spices, stirring one minute, then add the tomatoes. Cook together, covered, until the pieces are soft, stirring and watching closely so it doesn't burn. Add the meat and salt, stirring well into the mixture, cover and cook, stirring frequently so that it doesn't stick and burn. Add 3/4 cup of water, to the thickness of gravy, and simmer until tender. Serve over Basmati rice.

Note: MDH spices and bottles of ginger and garlic can be purchased at a local Indian food store.

Curried potatoes can be made of cubed potatoes fried in a small amount of butter and oil, with one chopped onion, 1 Tbs. pureed garlic, salt, and MDH curry spices to taste.

Chicken with Peppers

1 lb. chicken breast, boned and cut into bite-sized pieces (pork tenderloin can be used instead of chicken).
Marinate chicken with 8 dried and cleaned, chopped, hot pepper pods for 30 minutes, in a paste of 1/4 cup soy sauce, 1 tsp pureed ginger, and 6 Tbs. corn starch, coating the chicken with the paste.

In deep fat, fry small quantities of the chicken pieces, separating them as you drop them into the oil. Stir and lightly brown, removing from the oil and draining. Repeat until all the pieces are cooked.

Sauce

4 Tbs. soy sauce
1 Tbs. apple cider vinegar
2 Tbs. sugar
2 Tbs. corn starch

Stir together and cook to thicken. Spoon over chicken/peppers. Serve with fried rice, cashew nuts, or peanuts.

Nell's Famous Coconut Cake

2 cups, plus 2 Tbs. self-rising flour
1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
1 cup milk
1/2 cup shortening
1 1/2 tsp. vanilla flavoring
2 egg yolks, plus 1 whole egg
(save 2 egg whites for icing)

Grease three 9" round pans and dust with flour or, preferably, cover the greased pans with round coffee filters. (They work beautifully! Just don't get so engrossed in stacking your cake that you forget to peel them off!)

Mix all ingredients (except egg whites) with hand mixer, and bake in two layers. Bake 30 minutes at 350 degrees. Cool before icing the cake.

Icing

1 1/2 cups sugar
2 egg whites
2 heaping tsp. Karo syrup
7 Tbs. water
1 tsp. vanilla
Dash of salt

Mix in top of double boiler. Beat with electric mixer while cooking, approximately 7 minutes. Use only fresh coconut, reserving the milk from the coconut. Spoon half of the milk over the first layer, frost, coat with ground coconut. Stack the second layer, pour the remainder of the milk, frost top and sides, cover lavishly with coconut. Refrigerate overnight, to give the flavors time to penetrate. This cake freezes well.

Yummy Peach Cobbler

1 can croissant rolls
1 large can of peaches

1 stick of butter
1 cup sugar
1 cup orange juice

Open croissants and unroll them. Roll each one around peach slices and place in baking dish.

Heat butter, sugar and juice. Pour over croissants. Bake at 400 degrees till golden brown.

Blueberries or blackberries may be substituted for peaches. In that case, use grape juice instead of orange juice.

Chicken Fried Rice

2 1/2 cups raw Basmati rice, cooked in 4 1/2 cups water or chicken broth, with 1 tsp garlic puree and 1 tsp. ginger puree, and salt. Cool and flake apart.

8 pieces of white meat of chicken, salted, fried till tender, boned and cut into bite-sized pieces
2 cups fresh green onions and blades, sliced thinly
2 cups shredded carrots
1 lb. raw frozen green peas
Sprinkle liberally with black pepper.

Toss all of these ingredients together in a large pan.

Into a wok, put 1 Tbs. butter or ghee and 2 Tbs. oil with 4 eggs and salt. Scramble the eggs till 3/4 done, then add 1/4 of the meat/vegetable mixture, peppering liberally and adding 2 to 3 Tbs. soy sauce. Stir-fry to steam about 5 minutes, stirring some but not constantly, allowing the mixture some time to "fry". Pour into a large bowl and repeat process three times with the remaining mixture. Serve with fried peanuts (simply pour raw peanuts into hot olive oil, stirring and frying until almost done; they will continue to cook after removal from the heat, so don't let them start to brown), Serve with Sweet and Sour Vegetables and poppard (bread from an Indian food store) or lightly buttered and toasted crackers.

Sweet and Sour Vegetables

1 large onion, cut into thin wedges
1 bell pepper, bite-sized pieces
1 15 oz can crushed pineapple
1 large tomato, wedged.

Stir-fry in a small amount of butter and oil, beginning with onions and peppers; add tomatoes, then the pineapple. Don't overcook.

Sauce

1/4 cup vinegar
1/3 cup soy sauce
1/3 cup tomato ketchup
1/4 cup sugar
Reserved pineapple juice
1/2 tsp. pureed garlic
1/4 tsp. pureed ginger
3/4 cup chicken broth or water with bullion cube, with enough corn starch to thicken to texture of gravy. Cook till thickened. Pour over vegetables. Serve over fried rice.

On these pages are some of my favorite recipes!

Mongolian Barbeque

(This is a fun dish to have for family gatherings, and it takes much of the work off the hostess and allows the guests to participate!)

Vegetables, raw, in bite-sized pieces in small bowls:

onion
bell pepper
green peas
cauliflower
broccoli
mushrooms
your preference

Waters, sauces, and oils in cups:

water with salt
water with sugar
water with pureed garlic
hot pepper sauce
worcestershire sauce
soy sauce
clarified butter
olive oil
sesame oil

Meats

Semi-frozen and sliced thinly, so that the meat tends to curl from the blade. Your friendly man in the meat department might slice it for you, or use your own electric slicer.

1 lb. very tender beef (if you don't choose filet mignon, marinade it with pureed kiwi fruit rubbed over the slices -- a great tenderizer for steaks, too!)

1 lb. boneless pork loin or pork tenderloin.

1 lb. white chicken, frozen in a block, sliced thinly.

With woks or stir-fry pans ready, call the guests to the table for a prayer of thanks. Explain that each one chooses what he wants and then cooks it to his own preference of doneness. Supply disposable plates for gathering the food, and a stack of dinner plates when the meal is cooked.

Hints: Having liberally spooned oils and sauces over the meats, I usually stir-fry them a little before adding the vegetables and waters. Cook over high heat, stirring enough that the mixture doesn't burn, but allow it to have frying time rather than just steaming it by doing too much stirring.

Serve over plain rice (preferably, Basmati rice), with fried peanuts and hot crusty rolls.

This meal should be kept for memorable occasions because the preparation of the meat can be expensive and time-consuming — but everything can be prepared ahead of time! Expect double-takes when the guests look across the table and spot the platters of raw meat! Have fun with it!

Stuffed Peppers

2 lbs. ground beef, or other meat
1 large onion, chopped
3 garlic buds, crushed
Salt and pepper to taste.

Lightly brown meat, onion, garlic, and salt. Add 1/2 lb crumbled feta cheese or panir (Indian cheese). Cut 3 bell peppers in half and place in a slow cooker or a heavy pan. Spoon meat into the peppers. Cover with slightly under-cooked rice. Simmer, tightly covered over low heat for 30 minutes, until peppers are tender. Serve hot.

Basmati rice works best. For this recipe, use 2 cups of raw rice, with 3 1/2 cups of water, in a rice cooker or a covered pan, cooking on low heat after the rice comes to a boil.

Tips and Ideas....

1. Cover paper cuts, dry skin cracks, and kitchen cuts with a dab of household super glue. Amazingly, the cut does not get sore and is well on the way to healing within 24 hours!
2. Equal amounts of raw honey and raw apple cider vinegar, either full strength or diluted with an equal part of water will stop indigestion for me within minutes. I keep a mix of the vinegar and honey on hand, and take a little swallow when I feel the indigestion beginning. Of course, some people just can't stand vinegar ...!
3. Honey is a healing agent and can be used on minor cuts and wounds.
4. Vinegar takes the sting and swelling out of a bee or wasp sting.
5. An aloe vera plant is a necessary thing in the kitchen. It provides almost instant healing for a burn — the best sunburn lotion you can use! Better yet ... **IF YOU HAVE BEEN DIAGNOSED WITH SHINGLES, ALOE WILL SAVE YOU GRIEF.**
6. WD-40 is good for dozens of things. "Google" it and get the list. You'll want to use it often.
7. Make a paste of 1/2 cup of baking soda and water; spread on the area to be cleaned and leave it for 15 minutes; rub with a scrubbing sponge.
8. Dump 1/2 cup of baking soda followed by 1/2 cup of white vinegar down a clogged drain, and let it set for 15 minutes; follow with a big pot of boiling water.
9. After cutting an onion, rub your hands on stainless steel and the odor will vanish!

What Is “World Evangelism”?



“World Evangelism” is a program of mission work that grew from its initial conception in the mind of J.C. Choate — first, through God’s providential guidance, using those who prayed to be used — to the current work involving many people and churches, both in the US and in foreign fields.

In the U.S.

The Liberty Church of Christ sponsored our overall mission program from 1965 until J.C.’s death in February of 2008. They saw the value of the work and the need for it to be continued, so they immedi-

ately contacted supporting churches and individuals with the announcement that they would continue to receive funds and oversee the work, allowing me to go on with what I had been doing with J.C., and making it possible for other families to help carry on what J.C. had been doing here, as well as overseas. I am thankful that they continue to sponsor the overall program.

The Barriers

Wayne and Janet Barrier of Florence, AL, under the oversight of the Double Springs Church of Christ, along with their children, Jamie and Ka-

tie, **Joey and Anna, Jeremy and Robin** are a major portion of the World Evangelism team.

Wayne and Janet began working with us, after hours and during holidays, in 1983, while Wayne was still employed by Tennessee Valley Authority, and Janet was teaching at Mars Hill

Bible School. Many Saturday nights we have spent in their home, talking till late about the work, and getting up early to drive to a Sunday appointment.

After retirement from secular work, the entire Barrier family is deeply involved in continuing and enlarging the spiritual efforts in numerous countries. They have taken the lead in developing preacher training schools in these countries, and actively participate in the teaching programs: Myanmar Bible College, outside of Rangoon (Yangon), Yuzana Bible College, Yangon, Mandalay Bible College, Myitkyina Bible College, Kalay Bible College are the schools in Myanmar (Burma). Philippine Institute of Biblical Studies, Cebu, Philippines; Samar Bible College, Samar, Philippines; Viet Nam Bible School, Hi Chi Minh City; New Delhi Bible Study Center; Bangalore institute of Biblical Studies; Borneo Bible School; and China Bible School are others with which they are involved in supporting and teaching. Jeremy has made contact with Christians in Viet Nam and is working to set up a training program for those people. Across the border from Myanmar, they are also working with interested people and with Christians in China.

The Bates

Jerry and Paula Bates, sponsored by the **Strickland Church of Christ** in Corinth, MS, moved to Winona in August of 2007. They are invaluable as partners in the program



in Winona, with Paula taking over the accounting responsibilities and keeping our various lists of names and addresses corrected, and Jerry is busy reporting to churches, serving as Associate Editor for **The Voice of Truth International**, helping with layout and distribution of the books etc., etc. Of course the other half of their work is making trips to India, Sri Lanka, and Myanmar, Nepal, and Viet Nam to participate in the seminars, meetings and counseling being done in those areas.

The Rushmores and Rebecca

Louis and Bonnie Rushmore moved to Winona from Cameron, West Virginia, under the oversight of the Vermilion Church of Christ in Vermillion, Ohio in October, 2007. They are now sponsored by the **Siwell Road Church of Christ** in Jackson, MS. In May of 2015, Bonnie died of pancreatic cancer, a tremendous loss to all of us in the "World Evangelism team". Happily, after two years of loneliness and grief, on January 1, 2017, Louis married **Martha Noland**, the widow of Bob Noland, a long-time friend and preacher of the Gospel who had died a year previously, also of pancreatic cancer. Together, they are involved in overseas work, reporting to churches, and helping to cover office responsibilities. Louis is serving as the Editor for **The Voice of Truth International**.

And **Rebecca**, Louis and Bonnie's daughter, is an added bonus! Being a teacher, she also writes, and is willing to undertake impossible jobs such as bringing order out of the chaos of our Archives Room (next page) where we store a few copies of whatever has been printed in the States as well as overseas. Hundreds of thousands — actually, millions, altogether — of books, magazines, and tracts have been printed through the years and distributed throughout India and other countries in numerous major languages.

I look at those rows of books in our archives room and think of the printed materials they represent, books that are still working every day in many countries of the world.

Afterwards, they were surprised to see that it was a copy of **The Church of the Bible**, translated into Manipur, and printed in 1995! The work lives on and on and on!

I am so thankful to God for the vision J.C. had to make the printing of sound literature one of his responsibilities in life, enabling countless people to have opportunity to learn and obey the Gospel through these publications.

The Larsons

We first met **Dennis and Sharon Larson** in Jakarta, Indonesia where Dennis worked for

Mobil Oil. He has since retired, but he uses his skills as a computer programmer to keep our “World Evangelism” data current and correct. He and Sharon make the needed trips from their home in Cary, North Carolina to Winona, spending days doing the mind-boggling work, and charging nothing. Between trips, he is also available on-line, a blessing in those times of emergencies!

The McKees

Colin and Ellen McKee lived for a number of years in Indonesia, learning the language and establishing the church in Medan. They continue to make one or two mission trips a year, and to translate ma-

terials to be printed in Indonesia. They have retired from full-time local church work here in the States and are concentrating their attention on Indonesia.

Their time in Indonesia is spent conducting Bible training classes primarily with those who preach, teaching from the Scriptures themselves and answering the many challenging questions that are raised: “How do we explain the trinity?”, “Was Abraham tempted, or tested?”, “When do we receive our spirits?”, “What are false miracles?”, “Are Jews God’s special people today?”, “When did Christ preach to the dead?”



World Evangelism Team and Publications

Our purpose for existence is to help people have the study aids they need, whether they can afford to pay for them or not. We know what books mean to us, personally. And our hearts go out to those people in the rest of the world who have no available bookstore from which they can order materials written by members of the church of Christ.

But our work is more than supplying books, though they will continue to teach long after we, personally, have left the scene. Our work involves **“And the things that you have heard from me among many witnesses, commit these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also”** (2 Timothy 2:2).

One of the most effective ways of doing that teaching is through encouraging the development of Bible training schools. Yes, preachers receive training in these schools, but we encourage any and all in the church to participate so that they will be able to teach others the Gospel they have learned.

So, we send books there, we go there, we take books there, we print books and monthly magazines there, we provide funds for radio and TV programs there, we participate in seminars, Gospel meetings, ladies’ special classes, weeks of school sessions — and we counsel with the local preachers, offering encouragement and advice, and helping them to sort out the inevitable problems that Satan creates in opposition to any work for/with God.

World Evangelism School of Missions

In conjunction with Heritage Christian University, our World Evangelism team, led by Wayne, Joey, and Jeremy Barrier conduct two types of "Schools of Missions". At Heritage, evening classes are conducted once a month,

lessons taught by Wayne, Jeremy, Joey, or another of the Heritage faculty, in addition to input by an experienced missionary, such as

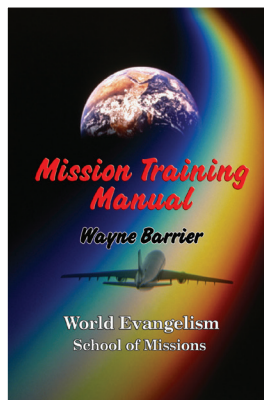
Gordon Hogan. Often there are panel discussions, enlarging the input of information

For the Future....

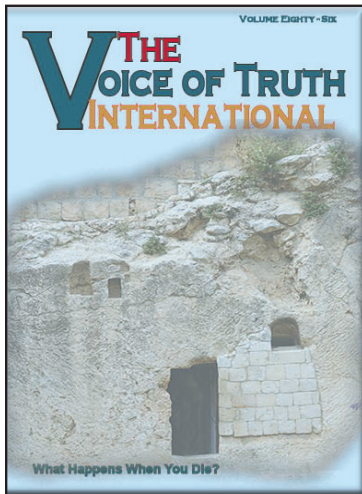

In late 1998, **Gospel Gazette Online** (GGO) was born of an idea and a desire to extend one's usefulness beyond the local setting, coupled with the (financial) go-ahead by my wife. Gospel Gazette Online made its debut in January 1999 as a monthly, religious Internet journal. Today, it is a 20-page, monthly Gospel magazine read by people all over the world (from all seven continents, including Antarctica). Obviously, GGO via the Internet is available even in some places in the world to which one cannot easily go physically with the Gospel of Christ (e.g. Saudi Arabia and Antarctica). Each issue contains articles by Christian men and women on a variety of biblical subjects as well as several features (an on-screen, interactive crossword puzzle; youth articles; one or more articles by women especially for women; questions and answers; and an audio message). In addition, thousands of articles from past issues appear in the archives and may be selected with the help of the site search engine.

Dozens of brothers and sisters in Christ have lent their studious pens through the pages of GGO to an international readership of both Christians and non-Christians. By design, short, teaching articles populate Gospel Gazette Online. Thereby, GGO seeks to edify both Christians and non-Christians with Bible-based lessons. Response from readers reveals a wide array of religious backgrounds, including members of the church of Christ, denominational bodies and world religions. Most fan mail is positive and encouraging, though some of it ranges from critical to hostile, bordering on hate mail. A couple of the more heartening posts include correspondence about baptisms in Saudi Arabia and the request from a Muslim in Pakistan that I pray for his sick wife. Subsequently, after initial contact through the pages of GGO, and later studying with Christians in his country, he put Jesus Christ on in baptism.

Any good that Gospel Gazette Online has done or continues to do is owing largely to the many Christian writers whose articles comprise each issue. Most of my immediate family has had or continues to have a significant role in any successes that may be attributed to GGO. If there is anything praiseworthy, let the glory be to God.

Aids to Evangelistic Outreach

Books we print here in the States — and books you buy — help us to help brethren in other parts of the world to answer their many appeals for biblical reading materials. **Have you thought about it: In India and Africa and Burma and Indonesia and so many other countries of the world there is no handy Bible bookstore from which people can order, to satisfy their hunger for spiritual growth! You help us to fill that need.**

We have a lot of “pride” here at “World Evangelism” — pride in what God entrusts us to do, but not much *personal pride!* Of ourselves we say, “We’re all Executive Peons!” Translated, that means that if some important thing needs to be done and only one of us is available to do it, that person is the “executive”, but if the bathroom needs to be cleaned or the floor swept, and only one of us is available to do it, that person is the “peon”! So far, it works pretty well! No one is the boss, and we’re all happy with the work God allows us to do.

Do you understand the kind of “bookstore” (warehouse — the waiting place for books between delivery from the printer to delivery to all kinds of addresses in the US and overseas) we have in Winona?

◆ It’s the kind with a policy of “Visitors may choose the books they feel they can use, and there will be no invoice.”

◆ It’s the kind where some orders come from book dealers, but



many more are from **World Bible School** teachers, people involved in prison ministry, and others in outreach programs and personal evangelism, and they get whole books for about the price of a tract. No other “bookstore” offers such a service.

◆ It’s the kind where shipments are made in bulk to brethren overseas, for mass distribution, and also in response to the requests of individuals, at no charge to them.

◆ It’s the kind that supplies study books for numerous preacher-training schools, in India, Sri Lanka, East Malaysia, the Philippines, the Pacific Islands, African nations, etc.
